The prophet Isaiah writes;



Slow-Cooker Spinach Alfredo Lasagna

Creamy, cheesy Alfredo sauce layered with chicken and spinach makes this easy slow-cooker lasagna an elegant alternative to the classic Italian dish.

Ingredients

- 2 boxes (10 oz each) frozen chopped spinach
- 2 1/2 cups shredded Italian cheese blend (10 oz)
- 2 jars (15 oz each) Alfredo pasta sauce
- 12 uncooked lasagna noodles
- 3 cups chopped cooked chicken (I used approx. 2 lbs of chicken, about 5 cups)
- 1/2 cup freshly shredded Parmesan cheese (2 oz)
- 1 medium tomato, diced (optional)


Directions

1. Cook and drain spinach as directed on package; squeeze out as much liquid as possible. Set aside.
2. Spray 5-quart oval slow cooker with cooking spray.
3. In large bowl, mix 1 cup of the cheese blend and the Alfredo sauce.
4. In slow cooker, spread one-fourth of the sauce mixture. Layer with 3 of the uncooked noodles (breaking noodles as needed to fit), one-third of the chicken, one-third of the spinach and 1/2 cup of the cheese blend. Repeat layers twice. Top with remaining noodles, sauce mixture and the Parmesan cheese.
5. Cover; cook on Low heat setting 3 1/2 to 4 1/2 hours or until edges are bubbly and center is heated through. Let stand 10 minutes; sprinkle with diced tomato before serving.

Session Minutes for December 6, 2016

A stated meeting of the Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Hastings, MN was held at 6:30 PM in the Fellowship Hall of the church on December 6, 2016.

The meeting began at 6:30 PM when Reverend Dr. April Davis Campbell lit the Christ Candle to remind us that we are leaders of this worshipping community. Her meditation was based upon Phillippians 4:6 “Have no anxiety about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be known to God.” (RSV) Her recent cares included a breast cancer screening. Requests for prayers from friends generated a very positive responsive. Don’t worry! The meeting was then opened with prayer.

Clerk’s Report: The November Session Minutes were approved as submitted. Work continues on the annual reports for GA and Presbytery.

Treasurer’s Report: Nothing jumped out at anyone about the treasurer’s report. The tithes and offerings were stated to be \$57,237 which would extrapolate to over \$65,000 for the year. The finances have been steady all year. The \$2000 per month draw from the Foundation will have to continue next year.

Foundation Report: The directors met briefly on Sunday. The good news is that the amount in trust is about the same as it was at the beginning of the year due to good performances from the investments. They will be meeting again to discuss distribution of assets for next year.

Pastor’s Report: M/S/C to accept the communion schedule for 2017. 2017 Communion Schedule will be the first Sunday of every month by intinction. Ash Wednesday (March 1) by intinction and Easter Sunday (April 16) in the pews. Other possible communion services would include Maundy Thursday, Blue Christmas, and Christmas Eve.

Pastor’s compensation for 2017 proposed: Salary \$21,458, Housing \$17,557, Deferred \$1,809. M/S/C to approve form ENR-111. Transitional Presbytery Executive Jeff Japinga will be here in January for informal worship. Annual meeting date will be Sunday, January 22. Annual reports need to be in on Sunday January 15. Grant application to Presbytery is due January 17. April is looking for some help. An estimate for the new sign with LED lighting is \$6600. Blue Christmas, Christmas Eve, and Christmas Day worship services are coming soon.

Presbytery Meeting: was at House of Hope in St. Paul on November 15th. Dave and Grant attended that meeting. The Eden Prairie legal battle stands at a current cost of \$600,000, Chain of Lakes Church will need to launch in the next year. The meeting ended early! Mary and Brenda were elected commissioners to the January meeting.

Deacons: Christmas Caroling will be on December 11th. There will also be a potluck on that day. They have recently refurbished visitor packages and the children worship bags.

M/S/C to receive all of the reports above on the consent agenda.

Committee Reports

Building and Grounds – Dennis – Our lift now requires either a constant pressure set of buttons, or a light curtain because we do not have an interior door. Looking for the lowest cost solution.

Fellowship – Brenda – 14 people attended the Martin Luther exhibit at the MIA last Sunday.

Christian Education – Kaitlin is doing a great job.

Mission – Mary – 8 Shoeboxes were collected, and generic goods under the tree for HFS is in progress.

Stewardship/Finance – Marcia Rash – M/S/C to send 25% of Peacemaking Offering to Lewis House. Budget for 2017: Mission Spending \$500 - \$250 for GA and \$250 for Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. M/S/C to approve the budget as proposed (see below). We'll be needing a new bookkeeper. M/S/C to request \$2000/month for the budget from the Foundation. M/S/C to extend Bob Albright's term on Foundation by amending the Foundation bylaws. An audit for 2016 is planned for the spring.

Personnel/Nominating – Have done some asking. Waiting for decisions right now.

M/S/C to receive the committee reports.

Old Business – None – still no guidelines for Presbytery grants

New Business - None
