Peace and Global Witness Offering October 1st

The Peacemaking Offering supports the peacemaking efforts of the church at every governing body level and provides an opportunity to witness to God's gift of peace in the world. During this Season of Peace, the Syrian refugee crisis has provided a striking example of the need for Christ's peace in the world. Part of this year's offering will be used to support Syrians displaced by violence.

Gifts given to the Peacemaking Offering through a congregation are divided in the following manner - twenty-five percent retained by congregations for support of their own peacemaking ministry; 25 percent used to support presbytery and synod peacemaking efforts; and 50 percent forwarded to the Presbyterian Peacemaking Program of the Presbyterian Mission Agency so that it can continue to provide assistance and resources for congregations and other bodies of the PC(USA). Online gifts to the Peacemaking Offering are used on the General Assembly level

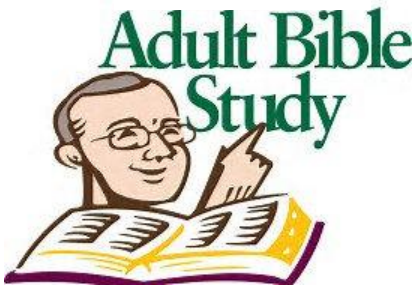

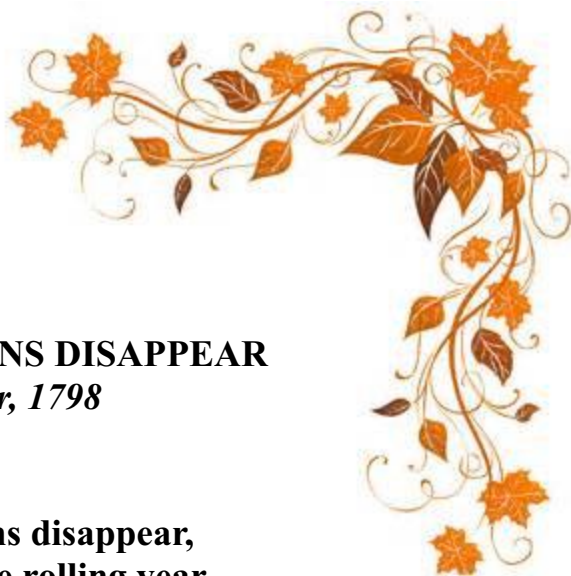


Peanut Butter Cheesecake Brownies

1 package (19 to 21 oz.) Brownie mix
1 package 8 oz. cream cheese, softened
1/3 c. sugar
1 egg
1/4 cup peanut butter
1/2 tsp. vanilla

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Prepare brownie mix as directed on package. Spoon into paper lined muffin cups (makes 15 to 20). Beat cream cheese, sugar, egg, peanut butter, and vanilla with mixer until blended. Spoon 1 rounded tablespoon of mixture into center of brownie batter in each cup. Press lightly into batter. Bake 30 minutes or until set.

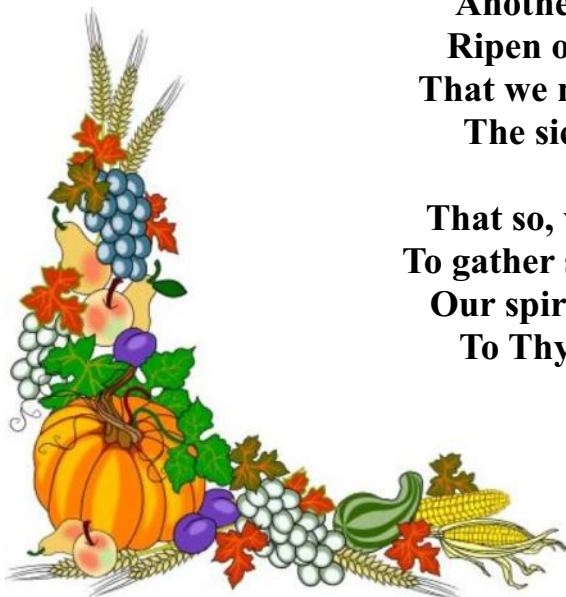
**Great God, as seasons disappear,

The sickle gives to lay us low.**

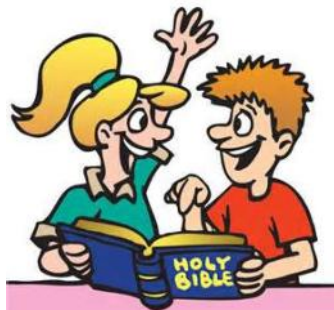
**That so, when angel reapers come

The meeting began at 6:30 PM when Moderator Reverend Dr. Stephen Robertson called the meeting to order. Brenda led the devotions. Guinea fowl raised in the South do well on cattle farms. Clerk's Report: All of the June minutes were approved as submitted. The death of Virginia Krier was reported June 28. Francis Woxland also died on June 20.

Treasurer's Report: The report still includes the Church Vitality Grant which tends to obscure the real situation. The tithes and offerings are on pace to reach \$66,500 (good!). The church expenses are presently about \$64,000. Included in this figure is money for the new church sign.
